

President's Message

As the president of the Board for 2002-2003, it is my desire to be proactive on several important issues that affect the practice of architecture, as it relates to the public, as well as build a stronger relationship with the Intern Development Program and those who are on track to become licensed architects.



The following are special issues that the Board is discussing:

Use of Seals:

Currently, the laws and rules governing the use of seals and the application of the term "Not for Construction" vary between the architectural and engineering professions. When used on the same set of construction documents, the differences between architectural and engineering documents may cause confusion to plan reviewers and others. Accordingly, the Board has established a task force, chaired by Dan Knight, to work with the Engineering Board, to review the application of seals and find common goals in interpreting when seals are required.

The Necessity of an Architect During Construction:

In order to protect the public's health, safety, and welfare, NCARB's Legislation Guidelines require that an architect be engaged during the

construction phase of any building intended for human occupancy or habitation. Since the adoption of this policy, West Virginia, Oregon, and several other states have revised their laws and rules to require that architects provide construction contract administration services on projects that have their stamp or seal. West Virginia's law also states that when an architect is not employed to provide this service, the architect shall notify the building official in writing, stating that he or she is not employed for this phase of the work. In the first phase in determining if North Carolina should have a similar requirement, a task force of the Board will begin a study of other states that require construction contract administration services.

Internship:

The Board appointed Dan Knight to serve as the IDP Member Board Liaison. In this capacity, he will work in conjunction with the AIA North Carolina IDP chairperson, as well as with the IDP representatives from the Schools of Architecture at North Carolina State University and the University of North Carolina at Charlotte. We have also recommended that AIA North Carolina develop an "Intern Friendly Firm Program" that will be modeled after the program developed by AIA Georgia. This program will aim at strengthening the internship process by recognizing

firms which meet specific criteria that encourage a positive internship experience.

The Board comprises five architects and two public members, all volunteers, who spend their time not only attending board meetings in Raleigh but also chairing and serving on board committees. Additionally, four of our architect members are serving on NCARB committees. I would like to thank all of them for their time and dedication in helping make North Carolina a better and safer place to live and work.

Finally, the term of Alan Baldwin, Jr., AIA, who served on our Board for twelve years, ended with the appointment of Charles H. Boney Jr., AIA. Alan served three years as president, as well as two years as president of NCARB Region III. He also served on and/or chaired numerous NCARB committees and received NCARB's President's Medal in 2001. Our architectural profession should be grateful for all the time Alan gave so selflessly. We all benefited from his hard work and expertise and we, Board Members, all truly enjoyed working with him. ☺

Corporate renewal forms for 2003 will be mailed in mid-October 2002. We would like to take this opportunity to review a few things prior to the corporate renewal period.

- **Correct address.** You may view the current firm information on file in the directory section of www.ncbarch.org. If the address is not correct please notify us via email, fax, or U.S. Mail as soon as possible. Notices will be sent to the last known address.
- **All individuals listed on the renewal form as architects practicing in NC as shareholders, officers, directors or licensed employees have current NC individual licenses.** Many individuals have yet to renew their licenses; individual renewals were due on July 1.
- **Please complete all sections of the form.** This may sound obvious but we often get a check and an incomplete form. All incomplete forms will be returned.
- **Include the renewal fee.** The corporate renewal fee is \$100. Forms without payment will be

returned, and checks received without a renewal form will also be returned.

- **Corporate renewal forms are due on or before December 31st.** In the midst of the holiday happenings many firms close, and the renewal form is often forgotten. We urge you to return your renewal form as soon as possible.

CONTINUING EDUCATION REQUIREMENT!!!

As the year comes to a close you are reminded that in order to renew your individual license for 2002-2003 (*notices will now be sent in mid-March 2003*) you must complete twelve hours of continuing education in the areas of health, safety and welfare by December 31, 2002. If you do not comply with 21 NCAC .0900 "Continuing Education" your license **will not** be renewed. The Board's list of approved providers of CE credits has been posted on the NCBA web site www.ncbarch.org. However, you should be aware that any program

or learning experience that you believe provides pertinent HSW education is acceptable for CE credit, as long as it can be documented.

NCARB Appointments

IDP Information

The North Carolina Board of Architecture has Intern Development Program (IDP) packets available for any interested interns. The packets are put together by the National Council of Architectural Registration Boards (NCARB) and consist of:

◆ **IDP Guidelines.** IDP Guidelines describe the program's objectives, resources, training requirements, and conditions. They also provide general information about architectural registration.

◆ **Application.** The application is for an NCARB Council Record. The IDP packet also includes instructions for completing the

application.

◆ **A list of NCARB jurisdictions requiring IDP training for initial registration**

◆ **IDP Mentor Guidelines.**

Mentor guidelines are provided for your mentor.

Web Site Information and Updates

In the summer of 2000 the Board added on-line individual license renewal to the web site. Slowly but surely, more licensees are starting to use the web site for the renewal of their registration. The percentage of licensees using the on-line system went up this year from 8% to approximately 13%. Our target is 50%.

If an individual wishes to change his or her address, the Board staff would like to remind them of the "Registrant's Only" section on the web site. The "Registrant's Only" section offers a convenient alternative to sending a change by fax or US Mail because the architect can personally make the change and feel confident that the record has been updated. To make an address change, the architect will need his or her PIN number. To receive a

PIN number if you have forgotten or lost yours, email the Board at nba@ncbarch.org and a PIN will be returned to you. Please include your full name and license number in the body of the email.

Another feature in the "Registrant's Only" section is the ability to select where you would like your license renewal sent: to your e-mail address or to your US Mail address. If you choose to receive your correspondence via e-mail, please be sure to include your correct e-mail address. If you choose to be notified by e-mail, you will NOT receive a paper notice. Board office policy does not allow staff to make this change for you.

The Board office has received a multitude of queries about wallet

cards. As mentioned in previous newsletters, the Board phased out wallet cards almost three years ago in favor of an online process. Now licensees can go on the web site to the "Directory" section and look themselves up by either last name or license number. No PIN is required for this process.

◆ After entering the directory section click on Licensees.

◆ Enter your name or license number.

◆ Click on "create a certificate."

The ensuing document is the new equivalent to the wallet card. Licensees may also use this feature to check on the status of their license. ☒

CE Frequently Asked Questions

The following was printed in the Spring 2001 Newsletter. It has been updated and reprinted as the Board staff has found that there are still many individuals who are not aware of the continuing education requirement.

On July 1, 1998 the NCBA adopted rules governing continuing education. The complete rule can be found on page 29 in the 15th combined edition of your rulebook (green cover) or on the board website www.ncbarch.org. Following are answers to questions frequently posed to the board staff.

To whom do these rules apply? They apply to every active registrant, unless exempt under rule .0906.

How many contact hours must be obtained? 12 contact hours must be obtained to renew the license (a contact hour is a minimum of 50 minutes).

When must the contact hours be obtained? Contact hours must be obtained during the calendar year. A calendar year is January to December.

The renewal year is July 1 to June 30, how do we report the hours if they are to be obtained during the calendar year? To renew your license you must show that you obtained the contact hours during the previous year. For example, to renew for 2003-2004 you must have obtained 12 contact hours in HSW during the calendar year 2002.

How are the hours reported? The hours are reported on your individual renewal form. A statement asking if you have complied with the CE rule is on the form, you must simply check a box indicating "yes" or "no". You do not have to send your CE log unless you are audited.

May I carry over hours from one year to the next? Carry over is not allowed.

What subject areas are required for CE credit? The contact hours shall be in technical and professional architectural subjects directly related to safeguarding health, safety and welfare.

How do I record my CE hours? The CE rule provides three ways to log your CE credit:

A self-made log showing the type of activity claimed, sponsoring organization, location, duration, the name of the instructor and amount of hours earned, or

A file of attendance certificates or other type of evidence of participation, or

Records maintained by the AIA/CES.

How long do I have to keep my CE records? The records must be retained for a period of two years after the credit is claimed.

Are the contact hours pro-rated if I became licensed in the middle of the year? No, you are completely exempt from the CE rule for the year in which you become licensed. For example, if you became licensed in August 2002 you would not have to begin obtaining CE credit until January 2003. Thus, on the renewal form for 2003-2004, you would check "yes", since you have in fact complied with the CE rule even though you did not have to obtain the contact hours.

I have emeritus status from the AIA, am I exempt from the CE rule? No, the NCBA and the AIA are different organizations, therefore you must apply to the Board for "emeritus status". See rule .0217 for the architect emeritus guidelines.

I am not a resident of NC, my home state requires CE, do I have to comply with each state rule? The requirements for NC shall be deemed satisfied by a non-resident registrant provided their state accepts NC CE requirements. If that is the case you may check "yes" on the renewal from as complying with the NC CE rule.

What if I don't do CE or don't comply with the rule? Individuals failing to obtain the required contact hours in HSW shall not be renewed.

How do I determine if a course will be acceptable to the Board? Contact hours must be obtained in the area of health, safety and welfare. The NCBA has defined HSW as follows: *Health:* Aspects of architecture that have salutary effects among users of buildings or sites and address environmental issues. *Safety:* Aspects of architecture intended to limit or prevent accidental injury or death among users of buildings or sites. *Welfare:* Aspects of architecture that engender positive emotional responses among, or enable equal access by users of buildings or sites.

The Board urges you to use your professional opinion as an architect to determine if a specific course is appropriate to fulfill CE requirements. NCBA shall not pre-approve individual courses or programs, however, organizations may apply for "approved sponsor" status. In addition to courses by Board approved sponsors, NCBA will recognize credit given to courses offered through NCARB or the AIA as long as they are HSW related.
